Bio/Data Corporation receives ISO 9001:2000 registration

HORSHAM, PA, December 1, 2005 – Bio/Data Corporation (“Bio/Data”), Horsham-based manufacturer, seller and distributor of hematological medical laboratory products, announced it has received registration from the International Standards Organization (“ISO”), a network of the national standards institutes of 153 countries coordinated in Geneva, Switzerland.

What makes Bio/Data’s achievement noteworthy is the company’s relatively small size – under \$5 million in annual revenue with approximately 25 employees – compared with much larger competitors whose annual sales figures total hundreds of millions in U.S. dollars. Typically, those larger companies are the only ones who strive for ISO certification, because of the expense and time involved.

Eugene J. Messa, president and chief executive officer of the 36-year-old Philadelphia-area privately owned company, explained that the entire process – including the establishment of high-level industry-specific policies, documentation and training and undergoing preparatory audits – consumed 21 months. “The auditors who were involved were quite surprised that a company of our size and staff could prepare and do so well,” he said.

For quality systems standards, ISO recognition is paramount to U.S. companies competing in a global economy. “If you can get registered, your quality system is acceptable worldwide,” Messa noted. “And if you tell people what ISO standard registration you have, they instantly know your company’s quality standards.”

ISO certification – Bio/Data’s designation is ISO 9001:2000 – removes the worry from prospective customers about quality, documentation or the process. “They know we meet that international standard. It’s a real door-opener for doing business with other companies,” Messa added.

“Our motto has always been, ‘Good Quality Is Good Business,’” said William M. Trolie, Bio/Data’s Marketing Manager. “That’s something you don’t see a lot any more, but we’ve had that drummed into each of us. And I think that was one of the things that impressed the auditors.”

Bio/Data’s flagship product is the PAP-8E Platelet Aggregation Profiler®, an impressive-looking laboratory instrument utilized for testing platelet function. Test results provide a vital pathway enabling medical professionals to diagnose various stages of hemostasis disorders, including hemophilia, von Willebrand Disease and Glanzmann’s disease, or to monitor the use of antiplatelet drugs like Plavix® and aspirin. Other Bio/Data products consist of reagents and disposables to augment the variety of platelet testing.

According to the International Standards Organization’s website, www.iso.org, “ISO is a non-governmental organization. Its members are not, as is the case in the United Nations’ system, delegations of national governments. Nevertheless, ISO occupies a special position between the public and private sectors. This is because, on the one hand, many of its member institutes are part of the governmental structure of their countries, or are mandated by their government. On the other hand, other members have their roots uniquely in the private sector, having been set up by national partnerships of industry associations.”
